

#### **Richland County Commissioners**

Each Commissioner is elected to a four-year term of office. Of our three commissioners, two are elected at the time of the presidential election, and one is elected at the time of the Ohio governor's election. Each commissioner serves a term of four years beginning January 1st, 2nd, and 3rd. Together they manage over \$20 million in the county general fund.

The Richland County Commissioners are the general administrative body for county government. They are the taxing, budgeting, appropriating, and purchasing authority. They hold title to county property. Individual commissioners have no power to act independently. All formal and official actions must be taken by the board, either with a majority or unanimous vote. In order to make Richland County a better place to live and work, the commissioners must take a broad view of necessary actions. As leaders, their exposure to all facets of county operations and the community at large provide them with the experience necessary to make often difficult decisions.

The Richland County Board of Commissioners is responsible for many areas of county government. Often, the services provided to county residents are the result of laws enacted by state legislators in Columbus. In addition to their own department, Richland County Commissioners are responsible for ten other county departments. These include the Department of Job and Family Services, Child Support Enforcement Agency, Emergency Management/9-1-1, Building Regulations, Division of Wastewater, Dog Warden, Dayspring, Central Services, Human Resources which includes Risk Management, and Building and Grounds Maintenance. Together these offices employ close to 200 people.

State law requires that at least 50 regular meetings be held each year. In a county the size of Richland, this requirement is easily met; the Richland County Commissioners meet an average of 100 times per year. Regular meetings of the board are held every Tuesday and Thursday, beginning at 9:30 a.m. Occasionally, meetings are held on days other than Tuesday and Thursday. Anyone wishing to be on the agenda to meet with the commissioners must call one week in advance to schedule a time.

Richland County Fair Campground Rules and Addendum

The price for a campsite for the 2020 Richland County Fair is \$200 for the week.

Special vehicle passes must be displayed in your vehicle at all times. The vehicle pass allows entry of the <u>VEHICLE ONLY</u> in the East Gate. Every person in the vehicle must purchase an admission ticket or have an admission pass. Please try and limit the amount of times that you enter and exit the campgrounds with you vehicle.

#### CAMPGROUND RULES

- Campers and vehicles must use the East Gate.
   ANOTHER CHANGE THAT WILL EFFECT ALL CAMPERS IS THAT <u>WE ARE NOT ALLOWING</u> VEHICLES TO PARK IN THE CAMPGROUNDS.
   VEHICLES WILL BE ALLOWED TO ENTER THE EAST GATE EVERY MORNING FROM 6 AM TO 12 PM FOR THE PURPOSE OF LOADING OR UNLOADING ONLY. AFTER 12 NOON, ALL VEHICLES MUST BE OUT OF THE CAMPGROUND AND PARKED IN ONE OF THE PARKING LOTS.
- 3. Each camping lot must have an adult leaseholder. The adult in whom the lot is rented to is responsible for all activities on the lot Leaseholders are responsible for keeping the lots clean at all times and using the trash containers provided.
- 5. Curfew for campgrounds is 10 p.m. (For everyone)
- 6. In accordance with state fire code, all campers must be parked with the hitch out toward access drive.
- 7. Law enforcement in the trailer park is under the jurisdiction of the Richland County Sheriff.
- 8. The campgrounds manager of the Richland County Ag Society will rule on any question not specifically covered in the rules.
- 9. The members of the Richland County Fair Board or the park manager have the right to remove any person or persons not abiding with the conditions of the contract.
- 10. Access roads should NEVER be blocked in order to allow passage of emergency vehicles to pass.
- 11. Intoxicants including alcohol or drugs found or observed in use, or the presence of persons under the influence, will be considered grounds for eviction.
- 12. Pets must be controlled in such a manner as not to disturb other campers. All pets must remain in the campgrounds and are not permitted anywhere else on the campgrounds including barns.
- 13. Electrical connections must be made in a safe manner and include a safe electrical ground.
- 14. No sewage or waste water may be discharged on the lot in the park area.
- 15. All water connections must be made with a food grade hose complete with a double check backflow devise as required by the health department.
- 16. NO open fires or chimneys. Charcoal grills are permitted.
- 17. ADDITIONALLY, WE ARE NOW OFFERING THE OPPORTUNITY FOR PEOPLE TO BRING THEIR CAMPER IN EARLY STARTING ON TUES-DAY, AUGUST 4TH FROM 5 PM TO 9 PM OR WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 5TH FROM 9 AM TO 9 PM. IF YOU BRING YOUR CAMPER IN ON EITHER OF THOSE 2 DAYS, YOU WILL BE ASSESSED A FEE OF \$40/DAY. THERE MAY OR MAY NOT BE AN ATTENDANT THERE TO AS-SIST WITH PARKING YOUR CAMPER. NON PAYMENT OF THE EARLY CAMPING FEE WILL BE GROUNDS FOR TERMINATION OF YOUR CONTRACT. Parking of campers can be done the week prior to the fair starting on Thursday from 5pm to 9pm, on Friday from 1pm to 9pm and Saturday from 9am to 9pm.
- 18. If there is not a camper on the assigned spot by Sunday at 9 am, unless other arrangements have been made, the campgrounds manager can fill the spot at his discretion with a person that is on the waiting list. Every campsite must have a camping vehicle on it, there will be no sites reserved for parking of vehicles.
- 19. FAILURE TO USE ASSIGNED CAMPSITE, GIVING IT TO SOMEONE ELSE, OR SELLING THE SPOT WITHOUT THE CAMPING COMMITTEE'S WRITTEN APPROVAL WILL RESULT IN LOSS OF CAMPING PRIVILEGES WITH BOTH PARTIES. BUYING, SELLING OR TRADING A CAMPING LOT IS AGAINST THE RULES. THE CAMPING COMMITTEE WILL MAKE THE FINAL DECISIONS CONCERNING THE TRADE OR ALLOWING SOMEONE TO USE YOUR SPOT WITHOUT THE COMMITTEE'S KNOWLEDGE. SELLING WILL NOT BE TOLERATED AND BOTH PARTIES WILL LOSE THEIR CAMPING PRIVILEGES.

### PER DIRECTOR'S CAMP SAFE OHIO ORDER The following shall also be followed:

#### c. Campers

- i. Only one family household may occupy each site, with a pre-determined limit for any campsite (always ten people or fewer).
- ii. Use social distancing and maintain at least six feet between individuals from other households in all areas of the campgrounds and with other campsites.
- iii. Do not gather in groups.
- iv. Practice self-contained camping when possible.
- v. It is recommended that, where possible, stay home if you are sick or do not feel well.
- vi. It is recommended that, if possible, campers wear a mask of face covering when entering buildings or interacting in close proximity to other campers.
- vii. It is recommended, if possible, campers practice good personal hygiene including washing hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, using hand sanitizer, refraining from touching eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands, coughing, and sneezing into an elbow, etc.
- viii. It is recommended that, if possible, campers bring trash bags, food, and supplies. Plan to carry in and carry out trash and other items.

Individuals or groups who wish to rent Richland County Fairgrounds, part of the grounds, or specific buildings can contact 419.747.3717 for rates, regulations and scheduling.

The **FAIRGROUNDS** consist of 106 acres in an easily accessible location north west of Mansfield, Ohio, just off U.S. 30 at Trimble Road. The grounds are well lighted for evening events and for security. Parking is available for 5,000 cars. The asphalt midway is 1,200 x 200 feet with an ell that is 300 x 100 feet.

The **FAIRHAVEN HALL** is steel and masonry construction with a clear span of 100 feet, an unobstructed depth of 180 feet and a 14 foot clearance. The concrete floored hall has restrooms, office, and kitchen. It is fully lighted, heated and ventilated.

The **GRANDSTAND** seats 2,400, has a ticket booth, restrooms, and food catering area. It is situated on an oval half-mile dirt track or can be used with the 16 x 24 foot portable stage or temporary stage.

The **YOUTH BUILDING** is concrete block, concrete floored structure with restrooms, showers, lighting and heating. It also houses a complete cafeteria.

The **ARTS AND CRAFTS BUILDING** has a 60 x 200 foot concrete floor, heated and lighted, with restrooms.

The **OUTDOOR ARENA** with 500 bleacher seats is available for horse shows.

Other **BUILDINGS** are available for winter storage of boats and trailers.

The **RICHLAND COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS FOOD SERVICE/FAIRHAVEN HALL – CAFETERIA** has quality food at affordable prices accommodating 50 – 1000. It is staffed by volunteers and all money goes back into the fair-grounds. ## 901:1-18-01 Chapter's application.

- (A) Animals listed in this chapter when moved or imported into Ohio for exhibition purposes only shall comply with the requirements of this chapter and when in compliance with the provisions of this chapter shall, with the exception of rules governing movement and importation of quarantined animals, be exempt from any other rules governing movement within or importation into Ohio.
- (B) Animals moved within or imported into Ohio for any purpose in addition to exhibition shall meet all movement and import requirements of Chapter 901:1-17 of the Administrative Code.

## 901:1-18-02 Definitions.

As used in this chapter:

- (A) "Exhibition" means any public show of animals which is sponsored by or under the control of an Ohio county or independent agricultural society organized under chapter 1711. of the revised code; or the Ohio state fair; or which is assembled for a period which exceeds thirty-six hours or contains animals of origins other than Ohio.
- (B) "Certificate of veterinary inspection" means a form from the state of origin which has been issued and completed by a licensed and accredited veterinarian attesting to the health status and identification of an animal listed thereon.
- (C) "Approved veterinarian" means any licensed and accredited veterinarian approved by the Ohio department of agriculture, or an employee of the Ohio department of agriculture or the United States department of agriculture, animal plant health inspection service, veterinary services.
- (D) "Licensed and accredited veterinarian" means a person who is licensed by the state of Ohio to practice veterinary medicine and who is certified by the United States department of agriculture, animal plant health inspection service, veterinary services, to be an accredited veterinarian.
- (E) "Residue" means any poisonous or deleterious pesticide governed by 40 C.F.R. 180, any poisonous or deleterious substance governed by 21 C.F.R. 109.6, or any other substance governed by 21 C.F.R. 556.
- (F) "Contagious or infectious disease" means any disease, including any foreign animal disease, or vector, capable of transmission by any means from a carrier animal to a human or to another animal and includes dangerously contagious or infectious diseases.
- (G) "Tuberculosis accredited free herd" is one that has passed at least two consecutive annual negative official tests for tuberculosis in accordance with the "Uniform Methods and Rules Bovine Tuberculosis Eradication", and has no other evidence of bovine tuberculosis.

## 901:1-18-03 Exhibitions: sanitation, inspection and records.

- (A) Each entity sponsoring an exhibition shall have in attendance an approved veterinarian for the duration of the exhibit.
- (B) Each entity sponsoring an exhibition shall:
  - (1) Immediately, prior to an exhibition and under the direction of the approved veterinarian, thoroughly clean and disinfect each building, pen, stall, ring or other enclosure in which animals are to be quartered for exhibition;
  - (2) Have the approved veterinarian:
    - (a) Examine the certificate of veterinary inspection when required for an animal brought to the exhibition;
    - (b) Inspect within a reasonable time of arrival each animal brought to the exhibit for symptoms of any infectious or contagious diseases;

- (c) Daily inspect each animal present at the exhibition for symptoms of infectious or contagious disease.
- (3) Maintain a record for one year from the date of the exhibition of each animal present at the exhibit. The record shall contain the name and address of the owner of each animal and the species and breed of the animal.
- (4) May order the immediate removal of any animal which in the opinion of the approved veterinarian places other animals at unacceptable risk of disease.
- (C) An exemption from the requirements of paragraph (B)(1) of this rule may be requested from the department and will be granted when, in the judgment of the department, cleaning and disinfection will serve no purpose. By way of example only, cleaning and disinfection will generally serve no purpose in a newly constructed building that has never been occupied.

#### 901:1-18-04 Exhibitors.

- (A) No person shall present for exhibition or exhibit an animal which he knows or has reason to suspect is affected with or has been exposed to a dangerously contagious or infectious disease or residue.
- (B) The owner or bailee of an animal with symptoms of an infectious or contagious disease shall, when directed by an exhibition official, the approved veterinarian, or an employee of the Ohio department of agriculture, immediately remove the animal from the exhibition premises.
- (C) Upon request, each person who presents for exhibition or exhibits an animal, shall make available any certificate of veterinary inspection, registration certificates, vaccination certificate, and other documents to exhibition officials, the approved veterinarian or an employee of the Ohio department of agriculture.
- (D) Each person who presents for exhibition or exhibits an animal for which a certificate of veterinary inspection is required by rules 901:1-18-01 to 901:1-18-11 of the Administrative Code shall forward a copy of the certificate of veterinary inspection to the Ohio department of agriculture's division of animal industry.

#### 901:1-18-05 Poultry and fowl.

- (A) All turkeys, chickens and gamebirds moved within or imported into Ohio for exhibition must:
  - (1) Originate directly from a flock or hatchery which is a participant in the national poultry improvement plan for the eradication of disease and be accompanied by documentary evidence that they meet the requirements of this paragraph; or
  - (2) Originate directly from a flock which has had a negative test for pullorum/fowl typhoid disease within twelve months preceding the opening date of exhibition and be accompanied by documentary evidence that they meet the requirement of this paragraph; or
  - (3) Have had a negative test for pullorum/fowl typhoid disease, within ninety days, preceding the opening date of the exhibition and be accompanied by documentary evidence that they meet the requirement of this paragraph; or
  - (4) Be tested for pullorum/fowl typhoid disease upon arrival at the exhibition by a tester approved by the Ohio department of agriculture and found negative.
- (B) The rapid whole blood test shall not be used to test turkeys for compliance with the requirements of paragraph (A)(2),(A)(3) and (A)(4) of this rule.
- (C) Waterfowl, doves and pigeons are exempt from this rule.

### 901:1-18-06 Cattle.

- (A) Cattle moved within Ohio for exhibition:
  - (1) The animals presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.
- (B) All cattle imported into Ohio for exhibition must:
  - (1) Be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within thirty days preceding the opening date of the exhibition and be identified with official individual identification;
  - (2) Originate from a tuberculosis-accredited free herd, an accredited free state or zone, or a modified accredited advanced state or zone;
  - (3) If originate from a modified accredited state or zone must comply with Rule 901:1-17-03 of the Administrative Code;
  - (4) If originate from an accreditation preparatory or a non-accredited state or zone are prohibited from exhibition;
  - (5) If from a brucellosis class A state or area/zone must be negative to an official brucellosis test within thirty days of the opening date of the exhibition unless: they are under six months of age, steers, or official vaccinates under twenty months of age (dairy) or twenty-four months of age (beef); and
  - (6) If from a brucellosis class B or C state or area/zone must meet all requirements for preentry testing as specified in 9 C.F.R. 78.9 and obtain an Ohio permit prior to movement.
- (C) Cattle from a brucellosis certified free herd or class free state or area/zone are not required to be brucellosis tested.

#### 901:1-18-07 Goats.

- (A) Goats moved within Ohio for exhibition:
  - (1) The animal presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.
  - (2) All sexually intact animals and any wether eighteen months of age and older must be identified with an official identification as defined in rule 901:1-13-04 of the Ohio Administrative Code.
- (B) Goats imported into Ohio for exhibition:
  - (1) Must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within thirty days preceding the opening date of the exhibition and be identified with official individual identification;
  - (2) The animal presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease; and
  - (3) The owner and the veterinarian must attest to the following statement written on the certificate of veterinary inspection "the goats in this shipment are not known to be under any movement restrictions because of scrapie."
  - (4) Originate from a tuberculosis accredited free herd as defined in rule 901-18-02 (G) of the Administrative Code for bovine tuberculosis eradication; or
  - (5) Originate from a bovine accredited free state or zone, or a bovine modified accredited advanced state or zone; or
  - (6) Originate from a bovine modified accredited state or zone must comply with Rule 901:1-17-06 of the Administrative Code.
- (C) If originate from a bovine accreditation preparatory or a bovine non-accredited state or zone are prohibited from exhibition.

## 901:1-18-08 Horses, mules and ponies.

- (A) Horses, mules and ponies moved within Ohio for exhibition:
  - (1) If not under quarantine and if they are free of any signs of a contagious or infectious disease; and
  - (2) If the animal is twelve months of age or older, the exhibition manager may require that the animal has been tested and classed negative to an official test for equine infectious anemia within twelve months of the opening date of the exhibition.
- (B) Horses, mules and ponies imported into Ohio for exhibition:
  - (1) Shall be accompanied by an official certificate of veterinary inspection issued within thirty days of the opening date of the exhibition; and
  - (2) If the animal is twelve months of age or older, it shall be accompanied by evidence the animal was negative to an official test for equine infectious anemia within twelve months of the opening date of the exhibition; and
  - (3) Upon request by an authorized representative of the Ohio department of agriculture, the person responsible for each animal must make available a chronological list of dates, places and events attended by this animal within thirty days prior to entry into Ohio.

#### 901:1-18-09 Sheep.

- (A) Sheep moved within Ohio for exhibition:
  - (1) The animal presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.
  - (2) All sexually intact animals and any wether eighteen months of age and older must be identified with an official identification as defined in rule 901:1-13-04 of the Ohio Administrative Code.
- (B) Sheep imported into Ohio for exhibition:
  - (1) Must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within thirty days preceding the opening date of the exhibition and be identified with official individual identification; and
  - (2) The animal presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease; and
  - (3) The owner and the veterinarian must attest to the following statement written on the certificate of veterinary inspection "the sheep in this shipment are not known to be under any movement restrictions because of scrapie."

#### 901:1-18-10 Swine.

- (A) Swine moved within Ohio for exhibition:
  - (1) The animals presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.
  - (2) Will be exempt from the requirement of a certificate of veterinary inspection if they originate immediately and directly from a pseudorabies stage V area.
  - (3) Swine originating from a pseudorabies stage IV area shall:
    - (a) Be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within thirty days preceding the opening date of the exhibition; and
    - (b) Originate from a pseudorabies qualified herd; or

- (c) Be negative to an official pseudorabies test within thirty days of the exhibition.
- (B) Swine imported into Ohio for exhibition:
  - (1) Must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within thirty days preceding the opening date of the exhibition; and
    - (a) Originate immediately and directly from a pseudorabies stage V area or an area or country recognized by the United States department of agriculture, animal plant health inspection service, veterinary services as pseudorabies free; or
    - (b) Originate immediately and directly from a pseudorabies stage IV area; and
    - (c) Be negative to an official pseudorabies test within thirty days of the exhibition.

#### 901:1-18-11 Llama.

- (A) Camelids including, but not limited to, llamas, alpacas and vicuanas moved within Ohio for exhibition when presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.
- (B) Camelids including, but not limited to, llamas, alpacas and vicuanas imported into Ohio for exhibition:
  - (1) Must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within thirty days preceding the opening date of the exhibition and be identified with official individual identification.
  - (2) When presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of contagious disease.

## RICHLAND COUNTY AGRICULTURE SOCIETY AUXILIARY

The RCAS Auxiliary is a dedicated group of 11 ladies who have a special interest in the Richland County Fairgrounds. Most of them are from a rural background and have been fair goers since early childhood. They VOLUNTEER their time to assist where needed, but primarily work in the food service area where they prepare and serve food for the scheduled events held at the fairgrounds throughout the year. Events such as auctions, flea markets, Bottle shows, Toy Shows, bingo, livestock sales, gun shows, The Buckeye Iron Will, camping rallies, wedding receptions, the Civil War show, the Ham fest, the Home and Garden Show, craft shows, Martial Arts contests, the Mock Crash and Holiday Parties keep us busy all year.

The Youth Hall cafeteria was built in 1994 at a cost of \$500,000.00 which we paid off in 2003. That along with the Snack Bar in Fair Haven Hall, a kitchenette in the Arts and Crafts Building and a snack bar in the Grandstand are the bases of our food service operations. However, we have set up in other buildings on occasion to accommodate event planners.

The monies realized from this service are funneled back into the Fairgrounds in the form of siding for all the barns, improvements for the Red Barn, replacement of barn roofs, vehicles, ice machines, a small freezer and refrigeration for the kitchens, plus many repair services throughout the year; all of which make the Richland County Fairgrounds the envy of other counties and provides a great place for almost any event.

To accomplish all this, the members of the Auxiliary need extra help for the really large events such as The Civil War Show and during the Fair. During the fair alone we need 30 - 35 people each day to staff the cafeteria and grand-stand. We are fortunate to have a group of wonderful people in the community who are willing to assist us. We simply could not do this without the help of community members.

We are always looking for additional members. If you have a special interest in the Fairgrounds and would like to join our ranks, you are welcome. All that is required is for you to purchase a membership of \$25.00. We meet the 4<sup>th</sup> Monday of each month in the Fairgrounds office at 10:00 am. #### CONSTITUTION

#### **ARTICLE I – NAME**

SECTION I – The Society shall be known as The Richland County Agricultural Society.

#### **ARTICLE II – MISSION STATEMENT/PURPOSE**

SECTION I – The Society's purpose shall be the improvement of Agriculture, Industry, Public Education and other interests beneficial to the people of Richland County, primarily through the promotion and organization of the annual fair.

#### **ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP**

SECTION I – Individuals residing in Richland County who are a minimum of 18 years of age can become a member of the Richland County Agricultural Society. Members need to work for the improvement of the Agricultural Society and follow the Constitution. Cost of membership tickets shall be determined by the Society and must be purchased before opening day of the fair. Membership shall be issued to individuals only and only upon payment of the annual membership fee. Only holders of membership tickets shall be entitled to vote at the annual election of Directors.

SECTION II – Membership ticket shall be on sale at a place designated by the Board of Directors for at least 30 hours each week from the Annual Meeting until the opening day of the fair.

SECTION III – Membership tickets shall bear the dates designating the period of membership the period of membership in the Society and a place for the signature of the person holding such membership.

#### **ARTICLE IV – BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

SECTION I – The Board of Directors shall consist of twenty-seven individuals who are elected by the membership. Eighteen (18) individuals need to represent their township within Richland County. The remaining nine (9) individuals shall be considered "at-large" positions. All members serving on the board must be current members of the Society. Individuals seeking a vacant seat on the Board of Directors must be a current member. A Society member can be appointed to a vacant township position and shall be allowed to complete that term. When the term expires, a resident from that township, who follows protocol, can seek election to the Richland County Agricultural Society Board of Director's position.

Vacant Seats to the Agricultural Society Board of Directors:

- Vacant seats to the board will be advertised in the Fair Office, on the Fairgrounds website as well as their social media sites. Ads will be posted a minimum of 2 weeks.
- Qualified Candidates shall show their interest in being appointed by writing a letter of intent addressed to the President of the Board. Candidates will be invited to a board meeting to be introduced to the board. Candidates must be members of the Agricultural Society.

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- During the next regular board meeting, an election will be held to appoint candidates to the vacant seats for the remainder of the term. All candidates will be presented to the full board for election.
- Vacant seats that become available within 6 months of the end of the term will not be appointed.
- Newly elected Board of Director individuals shall be sworn in at a regular meeting designated by the President.

SECTION II – The annual election of Directors shall be held at the place designated by the Board of Directors and notice of same shall be published in the Premium Book. The polls shall be open four hours as designated in the notice of election.

SECTION III – The President shall appoint three judges and two clerks who are members of the Society to conduct the election and declare the results thereof. Honorary Members can serve as judges or clerks during the election process. Candidates for election cannot serve as judges or clerks for the election. Candidates may witness the count either personally or by proxy. The judges of the election shall have the membership roll and verify the rights of all persons to vote before issuing ballots. The clerk of the election shall register the names of all persons voting and count, one copy of which register and tally sheet shall be placed on file with the Secretary of the Society, and the other shall be mailed to the Department of Agriculture of Ohio.

SECTION IV – It shall be the duty of the Secretary of the Society, to post a current list of the membership of the Society in a public place or to make sure a list is available for inspection upon request of any resident of the county.

SECTION V – Directors shall be elected for a term of three years and be so arranged that the terms of one-third of the Directors shall expire annually. The term of the retiring Directors shall expire and that of the newly elected Directors shall be sworn in at the October annual meeting.

SECTION VI – It is the duty of the Board of Directors to settle the business of the year by the end of November.

SECTION VII – Before assuming office each Director shall take the oath of office prescribed by the State Department of Agriculture in Rule VII and administered by a competent authority.

SECTION VIII – Absence from three consecutive regular meetings constitutes removal from the Board of Directors. The Secretary shall notify via letter anyone of this action.

To be excused from meetings:

- Member shall call the Fair Office stating 'unable to attend meeting'. This message will be delivered at the meeting. Roll-call shall show Excused.
- Members can place a call to another board member who will deliver the message at the meeting. Roll-call shall show excused.

Word Document Constitution Revised 10/23/2018  Members out of the county for three months are excused from meetings. After three months have elapsed, the member must call the Fair Office or board member stating 'unable to attend'. Roll-call shall show excused.

SECTION IX – In the event of a death, resignation, or moving out of Richland County, the Board is empowered to appoint a qualified Richland County Agricultural Society member to fill that vacant seat. A majority vote will grant him/her the privilege of filling the vacant seat for the unexpired term of that position. This individual must follow the protocol for the election to this seat on the Board.

#### **ARTICLE V – ORGANIZATION OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

SECTION I – The Board of Directors, as elected under Article IV, shall hold the election of officers at the regular meeting in November, electing a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer and such other officers as may be deemed proper.

SECTION II – The President and Vice-President shall be Directors and the Secretary and Treasurer may or may not be Directors.

SECTION III – All elected officers shall be on duty each day of the fair.

SECTION IV – The President and the Vice-President shall be elected to a 1 year term, with no term limit.

SECTION V – The Secretary's position and the Treasurer's position shall not be held by the same person.

#### **ARTICLE VI – DUTIES**

SECTION I – The President and Vice-President shall preside and/or conduct both the Executive and regular monthly meetings. They shall supervise all activities of the Richland County Agricultural Society that occur on the fairgrounds.

SECTION II – The Secretary shall perform the normal duties of that office, keeping records according to the laws of Ohio and the rules of the State Department of Agriculture and the State Auditor's office, and shall have such other duties as prescribed by the rules of procedure adopted by the Board of Directors.

SECTION III – The Treasurer shall be the custodial of all monies of the Society and shall have such duties as are prescribed by the rules of procedure adopted by the Board of Directors.

SECTION IV – The Executive Committee shall have full power and authority to execute any and all orders, contracts and other legal specified duties as prescribed and authorized by the Board of Directors. They shall make a complete report of any and all acts pertaining to contracts, purchases etc., to the Board of Directors at the next regular Board meeting. In the event that the President, Vice-President, Secretary or Treasurer is unable to complete their term of office, a chairperson shall be appointed by the Executive Committee and then approved by the Board of Directors until another individual is elected or employed to the vacant office.

SECTION V – A Fair Management Team of three individuals may be employed under contract executed by the Executive Committee upon authorization and approval of the Board of Directors. Individuals directly involved with the Fair Management Team shall reside in Richland County. Their purpose is to promote the prosperity of our county fair activities. Fair Management Team members do not need to

be a member of the Richland County Agricultural Society. Non-members will not have voting rights during Executive or regular monthly meetings. These individuals shall be appointed by the Executive Committee and then obtain approval by the Board of Directors. Their title shall be 'Richland County Fair Management Team'. These individuals shall be bonded at the expense of the Society in an amount not less than \$50,000.00 (blanket coverage) per individual.

Duties of the Fair Management Team

- Obtain approval from the Board of Directors for all entertainment on the grounds during fair week. A projected cost of entertainment must be submitted when proposing entertainment. Board members can suggest entertainment for fair week.
- Members of the Fair Management Team shall assist with obtaining contracts for concessioners, rides, agricultural and industrial displays not for competition. They shall be accountable for the fair advertising and editing of the fair book.
- Members of the Fair Management Team cannot judge any projects submitted by any individuals during fair week.
- Members of the Fair Management Team shall attend Executive meetings and regular monthly Board meetings and give a comprehensive report of fair activities. The Fair Management Team and the Events Coordinator shall synchronize activities on the fairgrounds.
- The Fair Management Team shall give a daily report of fair activities and attendance.

SECTION VI – A person shall be appointed to the position of Events Coordinator by the Executive Committee and shall reside in Richland County. They shall be given the title 'Events Coordinator' following approval by the Board of Directors. The Events Coordinator does or does not have to be a member of the Richland County Agricultural Society. This individual can be a volunteer or can be financially compensated for their work. Their salary may be adjusted according to events scheduled on the fairgrounds. He/she shall be bonded at the expense of the Society in the amount of not less than \$50,000.00 (blanket coverage).

Duties and Responsibilities of the Events Coordinator

- Schedule and coordinate activities on the fairgrounds except during fair week.
- Assist with general maintenance of the fairgrounds.
- Give monthly reports of events/programs scheduled on the fairgrounds.

Should an emergency situation arise the Executive Committee has the authority to appoint an interim Events Coordinator who shall then be approved by the Board of Directors.

#### **ARTICLE VII – MEETINGS**

SECTION I – The Executive Committee shall meet once a month at a time and place specified by the President. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held once a month at a time and place specified by the Board. Minutes from these meetings shall be given to all board members at the next regular monthly meeting. Minutes from meetings shall be mailed to any board members not in attendance. All meetings are to be conducted according to "Robert's Rules of Order".

SECTION II – The President can call a special meeting. The receptionist and those designated must notify all board members at least two days prior to the meeting. When summoning the special meeting, members shall be informed of the reason for this special meeting. No other business shall be conducted and a record must be filed of this meeting. All meetings are to be conducted according to "Robert's Rules of Order". Minutes from the meeting shall be given to all board members

#### **ARTICLE VIII – ANNUAL MEETINGS OF THE MEMBERSHIP**

SECTION I – The annual meeting of the Society membership shall be held on a date set by the Board of Directors. Society members shall be notified via mail when this annual meeting is scheduled.

SECTION II – The purpose of the annual meeting shall be to discuss recent fair events and make recommendations for upcoming fairs.

#### **ARTICLE IX – EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE**

SECTION I –\_The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and five other individuals following a majority vote from the Board of Directors. Any board member can attend the Executive meeting.

SECTION II – A member from the Ladies Auxiliary shall attend the scheduled Executive Meeting and give a report of their activities.

SECTION III – Executive Committee shall meet on the fairground at a place and time designated by the President for the purpose of discussing all activities which may be scheduled on the fairgrounds. The entire Board of Directors shall vote on items discussed at Executive meeting unless the matter is deemed urgent.

#### **ARTICLE X – AUTHORITY OF SOCIETY**

Section I – (In accordance with the Ohio Attorney General Opinion 2013-023) The Society may authorize the use of monies to acquire alcoholic beverages and a liquor permit to sell the beverage at an event that is open to the public and conducted on the fairgrounds and retain the revenue derived from sales.

Section II – (In accordance with the Ohio Attorney General Opinion 2013-023) The Society may (1) authorize the holder of a valid liquor permit to have an event that is open to the public and conducted on the fairgrounds and (2) receive fees from the permit holder.

#### ARTICLE XI – ANNUAL FAIR

SECTION I – The Society shall hold an annual Fair at such time and place as may be designated by the Board of Directors.

#### **ARTICLE XII – ANNUAL AUDIT OF SENIOR FAIR BOARD**

SECTION I - The President shall appoint an auditing committee of three Directors to inspect and audit the books and the accounts of the Secretary and the Treasurer and make a report of its findings.

Said report to show the resources, receipts and expenditures for the year. This report shall be made a part of the records.

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#### **ARTICLE XIII – AMENDMENTS**

SECTION I - The Constitution of the Society may be amended by a minimum quorum of twenty-seven (27) current Society members who attend the annual meeting. The Society members attending the annual meeting shall vote on the proposed amendments to the constitution which have been reviewed and approved by the Board of Directors.

#### **ARTICLE XIV – HONORARY MEMBERSHIP**

SECTION I – Individuals whom have served two terms as a Board of Directors shall become an honorary board member. They can attend any regular or executive meetings as a guest and voice their ideas on subjects discussed during these meetings. They do not have voting privileges. Honorary members can assist with activities on the fairgrounds and help at the annual election. Honorary members will be given one society membership pass.

#### **ARTICLE XV - CONDITIONS OF AUDIT**

SECTION I – A member of the Senior Fair Board shall be appointed by the President each year to serve as the Board's auxiliary committee representative. This representative shall periodically summarize the activities of the Women's Auxiliary.

It becomes the responsibility of the auxiliary to provide monthly financial statements of the activities held on the fairgrounds. Any financial activity that is generated when utilizing the Fair Board equipment/facilities shall fall under the Senior Fair Board review and be subject to state auditing procedures.

Any other group that utilizes the fairground's equipment/facilities must meet the approval of the Senior Fair Board. These groups shall supply financial records if requested.

#### **ARTICLE XVI - ORDER OF BUSINESS**

SECTION I – Order of both regular and executive meetings shall follow Robert's Rules of Order.

SECTION II– The order of business may be temporarily suspended at any meeting upon a majority vote of a quorum present.

#### **ARTICLE XVII - RULES**

SECTION I – Nothing in this constitution shall in any way supersede the laws of the State of Ohio or the rules of the Ohio Department of Agriculture pertaining to operation of a Richland County Agricultural Society.


