

# Richland County Agricultural Society Mission Statement



#### **Richland County Commissioners**

Each Commissioner is elected to a four-year term of office. Of our three commissioners, two are elected at the time of the presidential election, and one is elected at the time of the Ohio governor's election. Each commissioner serves a term of four years beginning January 1st, 2nd, and 3rd. Together they manage over \$20 million in the county general fund.

The Richland County Commissioners are the general administrative body for county government. They are the taxing, budgeting, appropriating, and purchasing authority. They hold title to county property. Individual commissioners have no power to act independently. All formal and official actions must be taken by the board, either with a majority or unanimous vote. In order to make Richland County a better place to live and work, the commissioners must take a broad view of necessary actions. As leaders, their exposure to all facets of county operations and the community at large provide them with the experience necessary to make often difficult decisions.

The Richland County Board of Commissioners is responsible for many areas of county government. Often, the services provided to county residents are the result of laws enacted by state legislators in Columbus. In addition to their own department, Richland County Commissioners are responsible for ten other county departments. These include the Department of Job and Family Services, Child Support Enforcement Agency, Emergency Management/9-1-1, Building Regulations, Division of Wastewater, Dog Warden, Dayspring, Central Services, Human Resources which includes Risk Management, and Building and Grounds Maintenance. Together these offices employ close to 200 people.

State law requires that at least 50 regular meetings be held each year. In a county the size of Richland, this requirement is easily met; the Richland County Commissioners meet an average of 100 times per year. Regular meetings of the board are held every Tuesday and Thursday, beginning at 9:30 a.m. Occasionally, meetings are held on days other than Tuesday and Thursday. Anyone wishing to be on the agenda to meet with the commissioners must call one week in advance to schedule a time.

To celebrate the 175th Anniversary the Richland County Fair Board commissioned local artist Drew Anderson to paint a mural celebrating the rich history of the fair spanning the last 176 years. The mural is located on the back left hand side of the Grandstands.

#### A little about the artist.

Drew Anderson was born and raised in Mansfield, Ohio. Growing up his imagination and creativity got him into all kinds of trouble until he found an outlet in art. In elementary school he was diagnosed with a particularly bad case of A.D.H.D. Nothing could hold Drew's attention, especially school, so he would sit and draw all day. Pokémon were (and still are) some of his favorite things to draw. School and Drew were not a good mix. The creative classes like art, band, shop and home etc., he'd pass with flying colors, the other, important stuff, not so much. As he grew so did his talents, his love of music came in 7th grade when he started playing the tuba, much to his parents chagrin. He quickly became first chair and was soon in the honors band. His artistic talents flourished in middle and high school as he was taught how to paint and all the techniques that come along with it.

After high school Drew struggled to find his place in the world, it was until 10 years later that he started painting again. Slowly but surely joining the local creative community in Mansfield. Since his re-emergence into the art scene, he has had numerous pieces at the Mansfield Art Center and La Luna. Recently he's branched out into performing arts, performing in such classics as "Grease", "Hello, Dolly", "Jesus Christ Superstar" and "The Wizard of Oz" at the Renaissance Theater and "Squirrel Lake" at the Mansfield Playhouse. This marks his 4th mural in Mansfield. Having collaborated with The Mental Health Board and Third Street Family clinic on "The Jericho Wall of Remembrance" located at the First Christian Church on 3rd Street and "Through the Eyes of a Child" put on by Richland County Children's Servies, currently on display at the Renaissance Theater. He also has a few small pieces in the art alley on the square and the giant Optimus Prime on a business window on 4th St.

He would like to thank his momma Julia Williams-Anderson for always supporting his artistic endeavors.



Tigers once occupied most of Asia, including India, China, Sumatra, Java and Bali. Some subspecies of tigers are completely extinct, while the remaining few are threatened with extinction. Protected by the Convention on International Trade and Endangered Species (CITES), the tiger is a particularly special animal, and Brunon's expertise in working with them shows in the vast knowledge he gives audiences during his performances.





Individuals or groups who wish to rent Richland County Fairgrounds, part of the grounds, or specific buildings can contact 419-512-1883 for rates, regulations and scheduling.

The **FAIRGROUNDS** consist of 106 acres in an easily accessible location north west of Mansfield, Ohio, just off U.S. 30 at Trimble Road. The grounds are well lighted for evening events and for security. Parking is available for 5,000 cars. The asphalt midway is  $1,200 \times 200$  feet with an ell that is  $300 \times 100$  feet.

The **FAIRHAVEN HALL** is steel and masonry construction with a clear span of 100 feet, an unobstructed depth of 180 feet and a 14 foot clearance. The concrete floored hall has restrooms, office, and kitchen. It is fully lighted, heated and ventilated.

The *GRANDSTAND* seats 2,400, has a ticket booth, restrooms, and food catering area. It is situated on an oval half-mile dirt track or can be used with the 16 x 24 foot portable stage or temporary stage.

The **YOUTH BUILDING** is concrete block, concrete floored structure with restrooms, showers, lighting and heating. It also houses a complete cafeteria.

The **ARTS AND CRAFTS BUILDING** has a 60 x 200 foot concrete floor, heated and lighted, with restrooms.

The **OUTDOOR ARENA** with 500 bleacher seats is available for horse shows.

Other **BUILDINGS** are available for winter storage of boats and trailers.

The **NEW SHOW ARENA** is 96 x 108 multi purpose building, concrete floor with restrooms, lighting, heating and air condition. Also this building is available for renting.

The *RICHLAND COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS FOOD SERVICE/FAIRHAVEN HALL – CAFETERIA* has quality food at affordable prices accommodating 50 – 1000. It is staffed by volunteers and all money goes back into the fairgrounds. 

The price for a campsite for the 2025 Richland County Fair is \$250 for the week.

Special vehicle passes must be displayed in your vehicle at all times. The vehicle pass allows entry of the <u>VEHICLE ONLY</u> IN THE East Gate. Every person in the vehicle must purchase an admission ticket or have an admission pass. Please try and limit the amount of times that you enter and exit the campgrounds with your vehicle.

#### **GOLFCARTS/CAMPER NOTICES:**

- Golf cart pass price will be \$100 for the week and may be purchased in the office.
- All golf carts must be unloaded and driven in with a pass displayed or will not be admitted on the grounds.
- Campsite lot rental is now \$300 for the 2026 fair due by 4PM Friday August 8th 2025 or site will be forfeited. NO EXCEPTIONS! Payment to be made at the Senior Fair office.
- All Campers and golf carts must enter through the east gate and must be checked in by a campground committee member.
- NO early move in unless approved and escorted by a campground committee member.
- NO stock/equipment trailer unloading in the campgrounds.

#### **CAMPGROUND RULES**

- 1. The licensee must be at least 18 years old and be responsible and held accountable for any behavior of all other persons camping with him/her, and also held responsible (financially) for any damages that may be noted at the as signed campsite.
- 2. Camper trailers to enter the East Gate ONLY during designated hours which have been stated above.
- 3. Vehicles may enter the campgrounds for loading and unloading purposes only prior to Sunday @ 10:00 am. After Sunday @ 10:00 am any vehicle remaining will be towed at the owner's expense. (Exception: Richland County Fair Maintenance Vehicles).
- 4. Electrical hookups provided are a single 30-amp service. No camper/trailer is permitted to draw more than the allotted 30-amps. Person(s) found to be using an adapter to draw more than 30 amps will have the power supply cut and the campsite and/or contract terminated with immediate removal from the grounds.
- 5. Electrical hookups must be made in a safe manner and include a safe electrical ground. All Water hoses need to be food grade standard.
- 6. Licensee is responsible for keeping the lot neat and clean at all times and using trash containers provided.
- 7. Persons under age 18 are to have an 11:00 pm curfew unless accompanied by an adult.
- 8. Quiet hours from 11:00 pm-6:00 am.
- 9. Access roads should never be blocked in order to allow the passage of emergency vehicles.
- 10. The arrangement of camping equipment must meet the approval of park manager.
- 11. No sewer or gray water may be discharged directly onto lots in the trailer park area. This is grounds for immediate removal.
- 12. Pets must be on a leash and controlled in such a manner as not to be objectionable to other campers. Dogs are not permitted on any other area of the fairgrounds unless showing or are a service animal.
- 13. Intoxicants or drugs found or observed in use, or the presence of persons under the influence will be grounds for eviction.
- 14. No open fires.
- 15. Law enforcement in the campgrounds is under the jurisdiction of the Richland County Fair Board and the Richland County Sheriff.
- 16. Campsites are non-transferable and subleasing is not permitted.
- 17. The members of the Richland County Fair Board or the park manager have the right to remove any persons no abiding with the conditions of the contract. The campground manager will rule on any questions not specifically covered in the contract.
- 18. Campsite payment for 2026 is \$300.00 and is due by 4pm August 8, 2025 or campsite will be forfeited. NO EXCEPTIONS!

#### OHIO'S LIVESTOCK HEALTH EXHIBITION RULES

#### 901:1-18-01 Chapter's application.

- (A) Animals when moved within or imported into Ohio solely for exhibition purposes shall comply with the requirements of this chapter.
- (B) Animals imported into Ohio for any purpose in addition to exhibition purposes shall meet all movement and import requirements of Chapter 901:1-17 of the Administrative Code.

#### 901:1-18-02 Definitions.

#### As used in this chapter:

- (A) "Official veterinarian" means any licensed and accredited veterinarian approved by the Ohio department of agriculture, or an employee of the Ohio department of agriculture or the United States department of agriculture, animal plant health inspection service, veterinary services.
- (B) "Certificate of veterinary inspection" means the same as an interstate certificate of veterinary inspection as defined in 9 C.F.R. 86.1.
- (C) "Contagious or infectious disease" means any disease, including any foreign animal disease, or vector, capable of transmission by any means from a carrier animal to a human or to another animal and includes dangerously contagious or infectious diseases.
- (D) "Department" means the Ohio department of agriculture or its designee.
- (E) "Exhibition" means the same as defined in section 901.70 of the Revised Code.
- (F) "Licensed and accredited veterinarian" means a person who is licensed by the state of Ohio to practice veterinary medicine and who is certified by the United States department of agriculture, animal plant health inspection service, veterinary services, to be an accredited veterinarian.
- (G) "Official cartag" means a United States department of agriculture, animal plant health inspection services approved electronic identification device that is both visibly and electronically readable.
- (H) "Residue" means any poisonous or deleterious pesticide governed by 40 C.F.R. 180 (2017), any poisonous or deleterious substance governed by 21 C.F.R. 109.6 (2017), or any other substance governed by 21 C.F.R. 556 (2019).

#### 901:1-18-03 Exhibitions: sanitation, inspection and records.

- (A) Each entity sponsoring an exhibition shall have in attendance an official veterinarian for the duration of the exhibit.
- (B) Each entity sponsoring an exhibition shall:
  - Under the direction of the official veterinarian, thoroughly clean and disinfect each building, pen, stall, ring, or other enclosure in which animals are to be quartered for exhibition immediately prior to the exhibition;
  - (2) Have the official veterinarian:
    - (a) Examine the certificate of veterinary inspection when required for an animal brought to the exhibition;
    - Inspect within a reasonable time of arrival each animal brought to the exhibit for any clinical signs of any infectious or contagious diseases;
    - (c) Inspect each animal daily that is present at the exhibition for symptoms of infectious or contagious disease.
  - (3) Maintain a record for one year from the date of the exhibition of each animal present at the exhibit. The records contain the name and address of the owner of each animal, the species, official identification (if applicable), and breed of the animal.

- (4) Order the immediate removal of any animal which, in the opinion of the official veterinarian, places other animals at unacceptable risk of any infectious or contagious disease.
- (C) The department may grant an exemption from paragraph (A) and (B)(1) of this rule upon request and for good reason.

#### 901:1-18-04 Exhibitors.

An exhibitor, owner, or bailee shall:

- (A) Not present for exhibition or exhibit livestock which exhibitor, owner, or bailee knows or has reason to suspect is affected with or has been exposed to a dangerously contagious or infectious disease or residue.
- (B) Immediately remove livestock with any clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease from the exhibition premises when directed by an exhibition official, the official veterinarian, or the department.
- (C) Present a certificate of veterinary inspection, registration certificate, vaccination certificate, or other document to exhibition officials, the official veterinarian, or the department upon request.
- (D) Failure to comply with the rules of this chapter may result in the department taking action pursuant to section 941.10 of the Revised Code, issuing a quarantine order, or issuing a notice of violation until such time that the violation has been remedied.

#### 901:1-18-05 Poultry and fowl.

All turkeys, chickens and gamebirds exhibited in Ohio must either:

- (1) Originate directly from a flock or hatchery which is a participant in the national poultry improvement plan (NPIP) for the eradication of disease and be accompanied by documentary evidence that they meet the requirement of this paragraph; NPIP status is only valid for one year.
- (2) Originate directly from a flock which has had a negative test for pullorum/fowl typhoid disease within twelve months preceding the opening date of exhibition and be accompanied by documentary evidence that they meet the requirement of this paragraph;
- (3) Have had a negative test for pullorum/fowl typhoid disease, within ninety days, preceding the opening date of the exhibition and be accompanied by documentary evidence that they meet the requirement of this paragraph; or
- (4) Be tested for pullorum/fowl typhoid disease upon arrival at the exhibition by a tester approved by the Ohio department of agriculture and found negative.
- (B) Any co-mingling of birds voids national poultry improvement plan status from the original flock or hatchery.
- (C) The rapid whole blood test shall not be used to test turkeys for compliance with the requirements of paragraphs (A)(2), (A)(3) and (A)(4) of this rule.
- (D) Waterfowl, doves and, pigeons are exempt from this rule.

#### 901:1-18-06 Cattle.

(A) Cattle moved within Ohio for exhibition must show no clinical signs or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease. (B) All cattle imported and upon entry into Ohio for exhibition must comply with rule 901:1-17-03 of the Administrative Code and be identified with an official eartag.

#### 901:1-18-07 Goats.

- (A) Goats moved within Ohio for exhibition:
  - The animal presented for exhibition must show no clinical signs or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.
  - (2) All sexually intact animals and any wether eighteen months of age and older must be identified with an official identification as defined in rule 901:1-13-04 of the Administrative Code.
- (B) Goats imported into Ohio for exhibition must comply with rule 901:1-17-06 of the Administrative Code.

#### 901:1-18-08 Horses, mules and ponies.

- (A) Horses, mules, asses, and ponies moved within Ohio for exhibition must show no clinical signs or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease. If the animal is twelve months of age or older, the exhibition may require that the animal has been tested and classed negative to an official test for equine infectious anemia within twelve months of the opening date of the exhibition.
- (B) Horses, mules, asses, and ponies imported into Ohio for exhibition shall comply with rule 901:1-17-07 of the Administrative Code.

#### 901:1-18-09 Sheep.

- (A) Sheep moved within Ohio for exhibition:
  - The animal presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease.
  - (2) All sexually intact animals and any wether eighteen months of age and older must be identified with an official identification as defined in rule 901:1-13-04 of the Administrative Code.
- (B) Sheep imported into Ohio for exhibition must comply with rule 901:1-17-08 of the Administrative Code.

#### 901:1-18-10 Swine.

- (A) Swine moved within Ohio for exhibition must show no clinical signs or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.
- (B) Swine imported and upon entry into Ohio for exhibition shall comply with rule 901:1-17-09 of the Administrative Code and be identified with an official eartag.

#### 901:1-18-11 Camelids.

- (A) Camelids including, but not limited to, llamas, alpacas and vicuaas moved within Ohio for exhibition purposes must show no clinical signs or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.
- (B) Camelids including, but not limited to, llamas, alpacas and vicuaas imported into Ohio for exhibition must comply with paragraphs (A), (B)(3), and (C) of rule 901:1-17-15 of the Administrative Code.

- 2.  $\underline{JUNIOR\ FAIR\ LIVESTOCK}$  will be admitted the Saturday before fair between the times of 8:00 a.m. thru 5:00 p.m.
- <u>OPEN CLASS LIVESTOCK</u> will be admitted the Saturday before fair between the times of 8:00 a.m. thru 8:00 p.m.
  - RELEASE TIME for Junior Fair Livestock and Open Class Livestock: 6:00 a.m. the Sunday following the fair.
- 3. For the convenience of livestock exhibitors, a veterinarian will be on the grounds each day. Any exhibitor having need for the services of a veterinarian will please leave written request, giving name and location at the <u>JUNIOR FAIR BOARD OFFICE</u> or the <u>LIVESTOCK COMMITTEE OFFICE</u> and the veterinarian will call at his next visit. The exhibitor will be liable for any veterinary charges incurred. Exhibitors are urged to contact their own veterinarian in case of serious illness.

#### NON-LIVESTOCK:

- 1. The non-livestock exhibits are to be set up Saturday before fair 12:00 noon thru 5:00 p.m. Please pick up your entry tags at the <u>SENIOR FAIR BOARD OFFICE</u> the Saturday before 12:00 noon thru 5:00 p.m., before reporting to your superintendent with your exhibits.
- 2. All non-livestock exhibits are to be displayed in the Arts and Crafts Building until release time the Sunday after 8:00 a.m. thru 12:00 noon.
- All non-livestock exhibits, except for flowers will be judged on the first Sunday of the Fair.
   This is to give the public the opportunity to know the winners in each department from the opening of the fair.

Do not enter 4-H classes on your entry form. 4-H classes are to be entered on your 4-H fair entry. To participate in the pull, you must show in either a halter or a hitch class

Each exhibitor is to furnish a rope behind each draft horse & for the duration of the fair. All draft equines must be owned by the exhibitor. Age of the animal recorded as of January 1st. \*\*NOTE\*\* for all halter, hitch and farm classes, the exhibitor's age should be as of January 1st also to be in line with Jr. Fair guidelines.

Exhibitors must specify the number of stalls needed: including a tack stall; on the entry form. Please specify if a box stall is needed for a mare and foal or for your horse. Draft equine may borrow only in get of sire & produce of mare halter classes and in the unicorn, four & six horse hitch classes.

Draft equines are permitted to wear their ribbon won in their respective class for the Champion and Grand Champion classes. Do not enter champion classes on the entry form as the winners will be entered automatically. Each exhibitor must display a suitable placard giving information on the animal (name, age, weight, etc.)







Only the participants will be allowed in the arena. Pullers need to inspect their equipment and only use equipment that is safe and in good condition. Steel doubletrees must be used-NO wooden ones! Weigh in will be at the discretion of the committee. Horses/ponies may take first, second, and third pulls. The animals must be harnessed properly with no loose straps. Light weight team is considered #3400 and under.

No open bridles will be permitted. No pulling shoes are permitted-plates with borium or 3/8 tacks are allowed. No headers will be allowed. Drivers are allowed one person to help hook the sled. The helper is not allowed to touch or whip the animals. Violations of any of the above will disqualify the team and driver from the pull. Drivers and horses must be ready to pull in order. Distance for the pull will be 21'. The distance between boundaries is 16'. Any forward movement of the sled after the driver gives command will be counted as a pull.

If space permits, second and third pulls may continue in the same direction; otherwise, they well reverse. A whistle signal will indicate that the pull is completed or the sled coming to a stop indicates the end of the pull. In case of a breakage of harness, the team will be entitled to another pull. The committee will decide any other questions or issues.

#### HORSES STAYING ON THE GROUNDS

Exhibitors must complete the stall request form located in the Richland County Fair Book. Stall request forms must be completed and turned in to the SR FAIRBOARD OFFICE by July 11th. Stalls will be assigned prior to the fair. You will be contacted by the superintendent with your assigned stall number. EACH FAMILY MUST PURCHASE A MEMBERSHIP/SEASON PASS FOR \$40 prior to or at the time of your entry. Exhibitors who choose to bring their horses for the entire fair must have all horses in place by Saturday August 2nd by 6:00 pm. All horses and tack must remain in place until Sunday, August 10th at 6:00 am. All exhibitors are responsible for their own bedding and feed regimens. Horses are to be fed and stalls cleaned out daily by 9:00 am. Exhibitors are to keep their stalls secure and must strip them at the end of the fair to receive premiums. Stalls must be checked by superintendent or SR Fair board member prior to exhibitors final departure.

#### GENERAL RULES

Age of exhibitors is as of January 1st of the current year. All youth 18 and under must wear properly certified ASTM/SEI Helmet anytime riding or driving an equine. A waiver is available but must be notarized and turned into the SR FAIRBOARD OFFICE prior to the fair. If you are a Jr fair exhibitor, you are not eligible for this waiver. Good sportsmanship will be expected at all times. **JUDGE'S DECISIONS ARE FINAL**. Horses are to be led in and out of the barns. No riding in the barns and horses are not permitted on the midway. 



#### **RULES:**

- 1. The base dates in determining the class in which animals should be shown are as stated in class listing. A heifer, under 24 months, in milk, must be entered in 2 year old cow class.,
- 2. To be eligible for competition, whether singly or in groups, animals must bona fide property of exhibitors, except where other wise specified. The exhibitor, if requested by the superintendent of cattle must produce certificates of registration of transfer showing ownership. Animals must be tattooed when required by registry. In the classes for get of sire & produce of dam, the exhibitor, need not own animals.
- 3. The owner of the dam at the time of service shall be considered the breeder of the animal.
- 4. Firms & co-partnerships entering animals for competition must be in existence sixth days prior to the date of closing entries & in all cases must be bona fide & the management may require affidavits of the age of the firms. Firms & co-partnerships entered into for show purposes will not be recognized by the association, but cattle bred by a member of the firm or company shall be considered as bred by the company. Should temporary sale or transfer of a show animal be discovered, the exhibitor & proper owner may be barred from any & all future shows.
- 5. Every Female over twenty-four months old must have produced a living calf within twelve months or prove to be with calf.

  Every bull thirty-six months must have dropped to his service a calf within twelve months previous to opening dates of this show to be eligible to compete. A Free martin heifer shall be barred from showing until she has become of age as to have proven
- 6. Any Exhibitor making a false or misleading statement, exhibiting cattle that have been artificially fitted or treated, showing an animal out of the proper class, substituting one animal for another without proper correction of records at the cattle superintendents office before entering the ring or for any other dishonorable practice, shall forfeit all premiums. If payment to exhibitors have been made before the evidence is given that such violations have occurred, the exhibitors must refund the premium money so forfeited to the Richland County Fair Board of the State of Ohio or be barred from showing at the Richland County Fair in the future.
- 7. The judge may, at his option, require any cow to be milked white in the ring or before the awards are made.
- 8. All animals must be shown in their proper class & may only be shown in one class except championship and group classes.
- 9. Judges must not award a prize to any unworthy exhibit. It is the intention of the management that no premium or distinction of any kind shall be given any animal that is not deserving.
- 10. Get of shall consist of three animals of any age or sex the get of one sire, not more than one male. Beef cattle consists of four animals.
- 11. Production of dam shall consist of two animals of any age or sex, the produce of one cow.
- 12. Exhibitors must specify on entry blank the number of animals entered.
- 13. Purity of blood as established by pedigree, symmetry, size, early maturity & general characteristics of the several breeds of all animals to be considered. The judge will make proper allowance for age, feeding & other circumstances.
- 14. Each breed to be shown separately for champion.
- 15. Do not make entries in Championship classes.

# RICHLAND COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY CONSTIUTION

## ARTICLE I – TITLE

SECTION I - The Society shall be known as The Richland County Agricultural Society.

# ARTICLE II – MISSION STATEMENT

SECTION I – The Society's purpose shall be the improvement of Agriculture, Industry, Public Education and other interests beneficial to the people of Richland County, primarily through the promotion and organization of the annual fair.

# ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I – Individuals residing in Richland County who are a minimum of eighteen (18) years of age can become a member of the Richland County Agricultural Society. Members need to work for the improvement of the Agricultural Society. Membership tickets shall be issued to individuals only upon payment of the annual membership fee. Only holders of membership tickets shall be entitled to vote at the annual election of Directors.

SECTION II – Membership tickets shall be on sale at a place designated by the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors will do everything within its power to be open for at least thirty (30) hours each week from the Annual Meeting until 4:30 PM on the Friday prior to opening day of the fair. Ticket sales will resume the following Monday after fair.

SECTION III – Membership tickets shall bear the dates designating the period of membership in the Richland County Agricultural Society and a place for the signature of the person holding such membership.

# ARTICLE IV - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

SECTION I – The Board of Directors shall consist of twenty-seven (27) individuals who are elected by the membership, all Board of Directors shall be considered "At-Large" positions. All members serving on the Board of Directors must be current members of the Richland County Agricultural Society. Individuals on the Board of Directors are required to abide by: the Richland County Agricultural Society Constitution, Standards of Ethics and Code of Conduct, Discrimination Statement, and Fair Director Responsibilities. Individuals seeking a vacant seat on the Board of Directors must be a current member. In the event that a position was included in the annual election but remains vacant, a society member can be appointed to that vacant position and shall be allowed to complete that term. In the event a Director, with time remaining on his/her current term is elected or appointed to a different Board of Directors position, a society member can be appointed to his/her previous position and shall be allowed to complete that term, (Exception: death, resignation, or moving out of Richland County – See Article IV, Section IX).

SECTION II – The annual election of Directors shall be held at the place designated by the Board of Directors and notice of same shall be published in the fair book. The polls shall be open four (4) hours as designated in the notice of election.

SECTION III – The President shall appoint three (3) judges and two (2) clerks who are members of the Society to conduct the election and declare the results thereof. Honorary Members can serve as judges or clerks during the election process. Candidates for election cannot serve as judges or clerks for the election. Candidates may witness the count either personally or by proxy. The judges of the election shall have the membership roll and verify the rights of all persons to vote before issuing ballots. The clerk of the election shall register the names of all persons voting and count, one (1) copy of which register and tally sheet shall be placed on file with the Secretary of the Society, and the other shall be mailed to the Department of Agriculture of Ohio.

SECTION IV – It shall be the duty of the Secretary of the Society, to post a current list of the membership of the Society in a public place or to make sure a list is available for inspection upon request of any resident of the county.

SECTION V – Directors shall be elected for a term of three (3) years and be so arranged that the terms of one-third (1/3) of the Directors shall expire annually. The "At-Large" positions will be placed into three (3) groups: Group A, Group B, and Group C. The term of the retiring Directors shall expire and that of the newly elected Directors shall be sworn in at the October annual meeting.

SECTION VI - It is the duty of the Board of Directors to settle the business of the year by the end of November.

SECTION VII – Before assuming office each Director shall take the oath of office prescribed by the State Department of Agriculture in Rule VII and administered by a competent authority.

SECTION VIII – Absence from four (4) of the twelve (12) regular meetings may constitute removal from the Board of Directors. In the event a Director has missed four (4) meetings, the Executive Committee will investigate the absenteeism, and make a recommendation to the entire Board of Directors. The President shall notify the Director in question.

SECTION IX – In the event of death, resignation, or moving out of Richland County, the Board is empowered to appoint a qualified Richland County Agricultural Society member to fill that vacant seat. A majority vote will grant him/her the privilege of filling the vacant seat. Said individual will fill vacant until the society's next annual election, at which time a director shall be elected for the unexpired term.

Vacant Seats to the Richland County Agricultural Society Board of Directors:

- Vacant seats to the Board will be advertised in the Fair Office, on the Fairgrounds website and other social media outlets. Notices will be posted a minimum of two (2) weeks.
- Qualified Candidates shall show their interest in being appointed by writing a letter of intent addressed to the President of the Board and complete a Board of Directors application.
- During the next regular board meeting, an election will be held to appoint candidates to
  the vacant seats. Candidates will be invited to this board meeting to be introduced to the.
  Board of Directors. Candidates must be members of the Richland County Agricultural
  Society, prior to appointment. All candidates will be presented to the Board of Directors
  for a final vote.
- Vacant seats that become available within six (6) months of the end of the term may not be appointed. This will be determined by the Board of Directors.
- Newly elected Board of Director individuals shall be sworn in at the annual meeting in October. In the event an individual has been appointed to a position after the annual meeting, he/she shall be sworn in at regular meeting designated by the President.

# ARTICLE V – ORGANIZTION OF THE BOAD OF DIRECTIORS

SECTION I – The Board of Directors, as elected under Article IV, shall hold the election of officers at the regular meeting in November, electing a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer and such other officers as may be deemed proper.

SECTION II - The President and Vice-President shall be Directors and the Secretary and Treasurer may or may not be Directors.

SECTION III - All elected officers shall be on duty each day of the fair.

SECTION IV - The President and the Vice-President can be elected for a one (1) year term, with no term limits.

SECTION V - The position of Secretary position and the position of Treasurer position shall not be held by the same person.

# ARTICLE VI - BOARD OF DIRECTORS DUTIES

SECTION I – The President and Vice-President shall preside and/or conduct both the Executive and regular monthly meetings. They shall supervise all activities of the Richland County Agricultural Society that occur on the Fairgrounds.

SECTION II - The Secretary shall perform the normal duties of that office, keeping records according to the laws of Ohio and the rules of the State Department of Agriculture and the State

Auditor's Office, and shall have such other duties as prescribed by the rules of procedure adopted by the Board of Directors.

SECTION III - The Treasurer shall be the custodial of all monies of the Society and shall have such duties as are prescribed by the rules of procedure adopted by the Board of Directors.

SECTION IV – The Executive Committee shall have full power and authority to execute any and all orders, contracts and other legal specified duties as prescribed and authorized by the Board of Directors. It shall make a complete report of any and all acts pertaining to contracts, purchases etc., to the Board of Directors at the next regular board meeting. In the event that the President, Vice-President, Secretary, or Treasurer is unable to complete their term of office, a chairperson shall be appointed by the Executive Committee and then approved by the Board of Directors until another individual is elected or employed to the vacant office.

SECTION V - A Fair Management Team of three (3) individuals may be employed under contract executed by the Executive Committee upon authorization and approval of the Board of Directors. Individuals directly involved with Fair Management Team shall reside in Richland County. Its purpose is to promote the prosperity of county fair activities. Fair Management Team members do not need to be a member of the Richland County Agricultural Society. Nonmembers will not have voting rights during Executive or regular monthly meetings. These individuals shall be appointed by the Executive Committee and then obtain approval by Board of Directors. Their title shall be "Richland County Fair Management Team." These individuals shall be bonded at the expense of the Society in an amount not less than \$50,000.00 (blanket coverage) per individual.

# Duties of the Fair Management Team:

- Obtain approval from the Board of Directors for all entertainment on the grounds during fair week. A projected cost of entertainment must be submitted when proposing entertainment. Board members can suggest entertainment for fair week.
- Members of the Fair Management Team shall assist with obtaining contracts for concessioners, rides, agricultural and industrial displays not for competition. They shall be accountable for the fair advertising and editing of the fair book.
- Members of the Fair Management Team cannot judge any projects submitted by any individuals during fair week.
- Members of the Fair Management Team shall attend Executive meetings and regular monthly Board meetings and provide a comprehensive report of fair activities. The Fair Management Team and the Events Coordinator shall synchronize activities on the fairgrounds.
- The Fair Management Team shall give a daily report of fair activities and attendance.

SECTION VI — A person shall be appointed to the position of Events Coordinator by the Executive Committee and shall reside in Richland County. He/She shall be given the title "Events Coordinator" following approval by the Board of Directors. The Events Coordinator is not required to be a member of the Richland County Agricultural Society. This individual can be a volunteer or can be financially compensated for his/her work. His/Her salary may be adjusted according to events scheduled on the fairgrounds. He/She shall be bonded at the expense of the Society in the amount of not less than \$50,000.00 (blanket coverage).

Duties and responsibilities of the Events Coordinator:

- Schedule and coordinate activities on the fairgrounds except during fair week.
- Assist with general maintenance of the fairgrounds.
- Give monthly reports of events/programs scheduled on the fairgrounds.

Should an emergency situation arise, the Executive Committee has the authority to appoint an interim Events Coordinator who shall then be approved by the Board of Directors.

# ARTICLE VII – BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETINGS

SECTION I – The Executive Committee shall meet once a month, time and location specified by the President. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held once a month at a time and place specified by the Board. Minutes from both meetings, shall be given to all Board members at the next regular monthly meeting. Minutes from meeting, may be mailed or emailed, to any board member not in attendance, at the request of the absent board member. All meetings are to be conducted according to "Robert's Rules of Order."

Section II — The President can call a special meeting. The Secretary must notify all Board members at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the meeting. When summoning the special meeting, members shall be informed of the reason for this special meeting. No other business shall be conducted and a record must be filed of this meeting. All meetings are to be conducted according to "Robert's Rules of Order." Minutes from the meeting shall be given to all Board members.

# ARTICLE VIII - ANNUAL MEETING OF THE MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I – The annual meeting of the Society membership shall be held on a date set by the Board of Directors. Society members shall be notified via mail and/or email and/or electronically, when this annual meeting is scheduled.

SECTION II - The purpose of the annual meeting shall be to discuss recent fair events and make recommendations for upcoming fairs.

# ARTICLE IX - BOARD OF DIRECTORS EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

SECTION I – The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice Present, Secretary, Treasurer and five (5) other individuals following a majority vote from the Board of Directors. Any Board member can attend the Executive meeting.

SECTION II - A member from the Ladies Auxiliary shall attend the scheduled Executive Meeting and provide a report of its activities.

SECTION III – The Executive Committee shall meet on the fairgrounds at a place and time designated by the President for the purpose of discussing all activities which may be scheduled on the fairgrounds. The entire Board of Directors shall vote on items discussed at the Executive meeting unless the matter is deemed urgent.

# ARTICLE X – AUTHORITY OF SOCIETY

SECTION I – In accordance with the Ohio Attorney General Opinion: 2013-023, the Society may authorize the use of monies to acquire alcoholic beverages and a liquor permit to sell beverage at an event that is open to the public and conducted on the fairgrounds and retain the revenue derived from sales.

SECTION II - In accordance with the Ohio Attorney General Opinion: 2013-023, the Society may:

- Authorize the holder of a valid liquor permit to have an event that is open to the public and conducted on the fairgrounds, and
- Receive fees from the permit holder.

# ARCTICLE XI - ANNUAL FAIR

SECTION I - The Society shall hold an annual fair at such time and place as may be designated by the Board of Directors.

# ARTICLE XII - ANNUAL AUDIT

SECTION I – The President shall appoint an auditing committee of three (3) Directors to inspect and audit the books and the accounts of the Secretary and the Treasurer and make a report of its findings. The report will show the resources, receipts, and expenditures for the year. This report shall be made part of the records.

# ARTICLE XIII - CONSTITUTION AMENDMENTS

SECTION I – The Constitution of the Society may be amended by a minimum quorum of twenty-seven (27) current Society members who attend the annual meeting. The Society members attending the annual meeting shall vote on the proposed amendments to the constitution which have been reviewed and approved by the Board of Directors.

# ARTICLE XIV – HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I – Individuals who have served two (2) terms on the Board of Directors shall become an Honorary Board Member. They can attend any regular or executive meetings as a guest and voice their ideas on subjects discussed during these meetings. They do not have voting privileges. Honorary members can assist with activities on the fairgrounds and help at the annual election. Honorary members will be given one (1) society membership pass.

# ARTICLE XV – CONDITIONS OF AUDIT

SECTION I – A member of the Board of Directors shall be appointed by the President each year to serve as the Board's auxiliary committee representative. This representative shall periodically summarize the activities of the Ladies Auxiliary.

SECTION II – It becomes the responsibility of the auxiliary to provide monthly financial statements of the activities held on the fairgrounds. Any financial activity that is generated when utilizing the Richland County Agricultural Society's equipment/facilities shall fall under the Board of Directors review and subject to state auditing procedures.

SECTION III - Any other group that utilizes the fairground's equipment/facilities must meet the approval of the Board of Directors. These groups shall supply financial records if requested.

# ARTICLE XVI - ORDER OF BUSINESS

SECTION I - Order of both regular and executive meetings shall follow "Robert's Rules of Order."

SECTION II - The order of business may be temporarily suspended at any meeting upon a majority vote of a quorum present.

# ARTICLE XVII - RULES

SECTION I – Nothing in this constitution shall in any way supersede the laws of the State of Ohio or the rules of the Ohio Department of Agriculture pertaining to operation of a Richland County Agricultural Society.
